My name is Cameron Peck and I am the grand knight of Mary Queen of the Holy Rosary Council in Lexington. I am heading up a project to get the state of Kentucky to issue a Knights of Columbus license plate. This is not an easy task and there are many obstacles that stand in the way of achieving this goal. The first, and perhaps the most difficult, is that we will need at least 900 members to have filled out an application and written a check for the cost of the plate (around \$25) before they will make the first plate.
